Description of First Aid Measures

Reactivity: Terraset[®] Component B Hardener reacts with Terraset[®] Component A Sodium Silicate to form a solid which generates methanol as a by-product of the reaction as well as the parent acids of the dialkyl esters consisting of adipic, glutaric and succinic acids. Methanol has an OSHA/ACGIH TWA of 200 ppm and a STEL of 250 ppm. Methanol can cause irritation to the eyes, skin and respiratory system and may cause dizziness, nausea and other central nervous system effects depending on its concentration.

Chemical Stability: Stable under recommended handling and storage conditions (see section 7). **Possibility of Hazardous Reactions:** Hazardous reactions will not occur under normal conditions.
